PIRATES HOST WOODS ON SENIOR NIGHT

The Park University women's soccer team will celebrate Senior Night on Wednesday night, with kickoff against William Woods University coming just after 6 p.m., at Julian Field.

Park (9-4-1, 6-2 AMC) is looking to rebound from a hard-fought 1-0 loss to conference champion McKendree University on Saturday, as the Bearcats scored in the 44th minute and shut out the Pirates to win, 1-0. Prior to the loss to McKendree, the Pirates had shut out two-straight conference opponents, beating Hannibal-LaGrange 2-0 and Harris-Stowe State, 10-0.

William Woods enters the contest at 2-12 overall and 1-6 in conference play, with its lone win in the league coming over winless Harris-Stowe. The Owls are led by Kelsey Evans' five goals and three assists, while Anne Weaver has added four scores on the year.

Caty Newbold leads the team in assists with four, also adding two goals, while Kristen Pelley has three goals on the year to go with three assists. Defensively, Anna Hatfield has spent more than 1,152 minutes in goal for the Owls, giving up 37 goals and making 76 saves. Woods has been out-shot 204-159 on the year, including 118-80 in shots on goal, and opponents have outscored the Owls 37-22 in 2009.

Park will counter with a defense that has allowed just four goals, helping Park outscore opponents 47-4. Monika Stoiber has played all 1,321-plus minutes between the pipes with a 0.27 goals-against average and 49 saves, and the Pirate offense has been sparked by

Ken Hefner is in his fifth season as the head coach of the Park University women's soccer program, entering the season with a mark of 59-25-9 at Park, while his overall record, including 29 wins as a men's head coach, is 229-163-19.

Hefner led the Pirates to their eighth NAIA tournament appearance in 2008, earning an opening-round draw before advancing to the second round and final site on penalty kicks at Dordt College.

Park finished the year with a 14-2-3 record, losing to NAIA national champion Lee University in Daytona Beach, Fla. Park also claimed its third-straight MCAC regular-season championship and fourth in the last five years, capping the conference season with a second-straight MCAC tournament championship at Julian Field.

At the conclusion of the 2008 season, Hefner gathered a pair of honors, being named NSCAA/adidas NAIA Midwest Region Coach of the Year for the third time in his career, as well as MCAC Co-Coach of the Year, marking his ninth career conference coaching honor. He also coached nine all-conference players in 2008, two of which went on to be named NAIA All-Americans.

In 2007, Hefner had the Pirates within one win of a trip to Daytona Beach, Fla., and the

NAIA tournament, but a loss to Kansas Wesleyan in the Region IV final ended the season at 12-5-2. The Pirates were MCAC regular-season tri-champions and MCAC tournament champions, while also producing an honorable mention All-American during the year.

In 2006, Hefner led the Pirates to a regular season MCAC championship, going 5-0 in conference play. Park dropped the tournament final to Bellevue, 1-0 but beat Kansas Wesleyan in the Region IV Tournament, advancing to the school's fifth consecutive appearance at the NAIA National Tournament. Hefner led the women past College of the Southwest in Round One but then fell to No. 4 Houghton College out of New York in Round Two. Hefner was honored as the Region IV Coach of the Year and MCAC Co-Coach of the Year.

Hefner ranks as the eighth winningest coach in NAIA history, owning 190 career women's wins in four seasons at Park, seven seasons at Lindsey Wilson College (1993-1999) and three seasons at Tennessee Wesleyan College (1990-93). Additionally, Hefner posted 19 wins as the head coach at NCAA Division I Arkansas State, helping his career coaching wins total to eighth all-time among NAIA women's coaches.

He also has 29 men's wins from his time at Tennessee Wesleyan.

While at Lindsey Wilson, Hefner's teams advanced to the national tournament twice (1998, 1999) and achieved a final national ranking of fifth following the 1999 season. In seven seasons at Lindsey Wilson, he posted a 93-46-5 record and had 11 players earn NAIA All-America honors.

In 1999, Hefner was tabbed to lead a start-up soccer program at Arkansas State, which began play in 2000. His teams qualified for the Sun Belt Conference tournament four years in a row under his guidance and had three players named to the all-conference team from 2000-2003.

In addition to Hefner's success on the field, his players have enjoyed success in the classroom. At Lindsey Wilson, he had 18 academic all-conference selections and eight NAIA All-America Scholar-Athletes. During his time at Arkansas State, his team owned an overall GPA of 3.0 or better in six of seven semesters while he was at ASU.

Hefner, who owns a United States Soccer Federation National "B" License, an Advanced National License and an NSCAA National Diploma, earned a bachelor of arts in psychology from West Georgia College in 1987. He and his wife, Dawn, have three children, Matthew (23), Megan (22) and Mackenzie (18).

Natalie Parker has also added to the offense this season with 11 scores and is the team leader in assists with four, totaling 26 points on the year. Nori Gedei joins Parker in the assist column at four while scoring three goals on the year. Juneille Watkins has scored eight times on the year with three assists, and Dana Hemmingsen, Shea Brazill and Emilia Sheffer have all also distributed three assists for scores on the year.

On the year, Park holds a 265-133 shots advantage on opponents, with a 141-53 edge in shots on goal.

Prior to Wednesday's match, Park University will honor seniors Shea Brazill, Ivy Chapin, Kitti Katona and Natalie Parker in a brief ceremony scheduled to begin at 5:45 p.m. In addition, all gate proceeds from Wednesday's match will be donated to Breast Cancer Awareness, and no season passes or identification cards will be honored for free admission. Fans are encouraged to donate as much as they can to the cause, and collection will take place at the front gate to Julian Field.

WATKINS HAT TRICK DRAWS AMC WEEKLY HONORS

The American Midwest Conference has announced its Women's Soccer Player of the Week honorees for Oct. 19-25, including Park freshman forward Juneille Watkins.

Watkins was named AMC Women's Soccer Offensive Player of the Week, while Liz Yanko from McKendree University has been tabbed as the AMC Women's Soccer Defensive Player of the Week.

Watkins, who came to Park from St. Andrew, Jamaica, netted her first career hat trick in the Pirates' 10-0 AMC victory at Harris-Stowe State University. Watkins' effort helped propel Park, the No. 19-ranked team in the NAIA, to its ninth victory of 2009.

Yanko, a junior goalkeeper from St. Louis, Mo., was solid in goal for three AMC victories last week. She allowed just one goal on the week in a 2-1 road win at Missouri Baptist.

Yanko closed out the week with consecutive shutouts at home against Hannibal-LaGrange College (3-0) and No. 19-ranked Park University (1-0). The win over Park enabled McKendree, the No. 9-rated team in the latest NAIA poll, to claim its seventh consecutive AMC regular-season title.

PIRATES HOLD GROUND AT NO. 19 IN NAIA TOP 25

The Park University women's soccer team held its ground in the most recent NAIA Women's Soccer Top 25 Coaches Poll, staying at No. 19 despite a 1-1 week and a loss to now No. 10 McKendree over the weekend.

Park (9-4-1) is 6-2 in the American Midwest Conference, and the Pirates play William Woods University on Senior Night Wednesday at 6 p.m. The Pirates wrap up the regular season Saturday on the road, taking on Missouri Baptist University in the St. Louis area.

The Pirates did grab a win last week, putting up 10 goals on Harris-Stowe State, and on the season, Park has given up only four goals to opponents, including just one in regulation. The Pirates have given up three overtime goals while outscoring opponents 47-4.

Lindsey Wilson earned 16 first-place votes and 617 points to hold on to the No. 1 spot for the third week in a row. Lee University earned six first-place votes and 607 points to take sole possession of the No. 2 ranking, and the rest of the top five rounded out with No. 3 Azusa Pacific, No. 4 William Carey and No. 5 Martin Methodist.

Lindsey Wilson and Lee separated from the rest of the top five this week, having a 50 point advantage over the third-place team Azusa Pacific. Lindsey Wilson is on a 13-game unbeaten streak and has shut out its last five opponents by a combined score of 38-0. Lee has won 11-straight matches, six coming by way of shutout. The Lady Flames have not lost since Sept. 12, dropping a 2-1 decision to Lindsey Wilson.

No. 12 College of Idaho joins No. 23 William Jewell (Mo.) and No. 25 Houghton (N.Y.) as newcomers to this week's Top 25 rankings. William Jewell and Houghton have been previously ranked this season, while this is the first time that the College of Idaho has been ranked in the Top 25 poll dating back to 1999.
