NO. 24 PARK RENEWS COLUMBIA RIVALRY SATURDAY

The No. 24-ranked Park University men's basketball team will renew a long-time American Midwest Conference rivalry Saturday afternoon at Breckon Sports Center, as the Pirates host Columbia College at 4 p.m.

Park (15-7, 8-1 AMC) is looking for its second-straight league victory after defeating Missouri Baptist by 23 on Thursday night, and a season sweep of Columbia is also on the line after the teams met Jan. 9, when Park picked up a 94-68 victory in its 2009-10 AMC opener.

Columbia is 3-5 in the AMC and tied for fourth place with Williams Baptist and Missouri Baptist, and Thursday night, the Cougars defeated Williams, 75-51, avenging an earlier loss to the Eagles in Walnut Ridge, Ark. The win improved Columbia's record to 9-15, overall.

Kyle Rausch led Park in its victory Thursday night with 20 points and 13 rebounds, upping his season scoring average to 8.4 points per game and his rebounding average to 6.1. Herschel Rodgers leads Park in both categories, averaging 16.2 points and 7.7 rebounds per game, and Terrell Dyer adds 10.4 points per game to a Park offense that averages 76.5 points per game, including 86 points per game in the AMC.

Goldeng Deng, Tyler Price and Reco Anderson all average near seven points per contest for the Pirates, and Price is the team's top 3-point threat, knocking down 43 triples in the 2009-10 season.

Derrick Howard helps set the offense with 68 assists on the year, and he also leads the team defensively with 59 steals. Rodgers adds to the defense with 50 steals, and as a team, the Pirates have turned opponents over 460 times on the year.

Columbia will attempt to counter the Park defense with an offense averaging 64.8 points per game, led by Chad Thompson's 14.6 points per game, followed by 8.5 points from Kansas City-native Quintin Totta. Taylor Evans, Jaron Strickland and Greg Stegeman average eight points each, for the Cougars, who shoot 41.4-percent as a team.

Park shoots 46.5-percent as a unit, and the Pirates are outrebounding opponents 35-33,

MOBAP GAME NOTES

- Park University hit the 80-point mark for the sixth time in nine conference games, Thursday night, scoring 86 points at Missouri Baptist. The game also marked the seventh conference win for the Pirates with at least a 20-point spread, with the only win inside 20 points coming at Harris-Stowe, 68-65.

- Kyle Rausch had a break-out game for Park on Thursday, notching his first-ever collegiate double-double with career highs in points (20) and rebounds (13). Rausch also posted a career-high for field goals, knocking down nine baskets, and he matched his career-high for assists with three, a total also reached earlier this season at Harris-Stowe.

- Goldeng Deng also added a pair of career-high totals in the game against MoBap, scoring a career-best 19 points while also matching Rausch from the field, hitting 9-of-13.

- A game after scoring 20 points against McKendree, Terrell Dyer distributed the ball on Thursday Night, dishing out six assists to go with his 10 points.

- Thursday's win over Missouri Baptist was the second in nine days for the Pirates over the Spartans after last Tuesday's 105-65 win in Parkville. The win also put the Pirates up one game in the all-time series, as Park took a 21-20 lead in the 41-game series.

- Park used its seventh different starting lineup of the 2009-10 season Thursday, going with Derrick Howard, Goldeng Deng, Terrell Dyer, Herschel Rodgers and Kyle Rausch against the Spartans.

DOWN THE STRETCH

Park will play four of its last six games at home in the final month of the regular season, beginning Saturday against Columbia. After the game with the Cougars, Park will take seven days off before a non-conference rematch from earlier this year, when Central Bible comes to Breckon Sports Center Feb. 13 at 1 p.m.

The Pirates defeated CBC in November, 86-48, in Springfield, Mo. After CBC, which marks the final non-conference game of the regular season, a three-game week ensues, as Harris-Stowe State visits on Tuesday, Feb. 16, followed by a road contest two days later at William Woods, and wrapping up at home Feb. 20 against Hannibal-LaGrange for Senior Day.

All of the games in the three-game week are conference rematches from earlier this sea-

COLUMBIA LOOKING FOR THIRD-STRAIGHT

Columbia College comes into Saturday's game at Breckon Sports Center in search of its third-straight victory after knocking off Williams Baptist by 24 points Thursday night at the Southwell Complex. The Cougars also got a win, Saturday, over William Woods by a count of 74-56.

PIRATES HOLD SPOT IN NAIA TOP 25

The Park University men's basketball team remained ranked No. 24 in the NAIA Division I Men's Basketball Top 25 Coaches Poll Monday, holding its spot from a week ago after a 40-point win last week over Missouri Baptist, followed by a six-point conference loss to No. 7 McKendree in last week's College Fanz NAIA Game of the Week at Breckon sports Center.

With just one team undefeated, that same program Mountain State (W.Va.), holds strong at No. 1 in the sixth edition of the 2009-2010 NAIA Division I Men's Basketball Coaches' Top 25 Poll, released by the NAIA office Monday. The Cougars, who are a school-best 23-0 overall, have been the top-ranked team for the last six polls. Mountain State earned all 12 first-place votes and 312 total points.

This poll marks the first time this year that a team was a unanimous pick for No. 1. In the previous five polls (including preseason), the first-place votes were split among at least the top-three teams. Moving up one spot to its highest ranking this year, No. 2 Oklahoma Baptist gathered 298 points. Due to severe weather last week, Oklahoma Baptist did not play.

No. 3 Biola (Calif.) also jumps one spot into its highest position this year. The Eagles stand 20-1 overall after a 75-62 road win at Point Loma Nazarene (Calif.) on Jan. 28. Due to two upset losses last week, Concordia (Calif.) drops two positions to No. 4.

For the fourth straight week, Louisiana State-Shreveport is ranked at No. 5. The Pilots earned 273 total points and stand at 19-2 on the year. In addition to McKendree, one other Park opponent remained in this week's Top 25, as Central Methodist climbed two spots to No. 11.

William Jewell, who split with Park in November, is just outside the Top 25 at No. 26 with 48 points, while two more Pirate opponents from the first semester, Evangel and MidAmerica Nazarene, earned votes in this week's poll, which was voted upon by a panel of head coaches representing each of the conferences and independents. The seventh regular season Top 25 poll will be announced on Monday, Feb. 8.

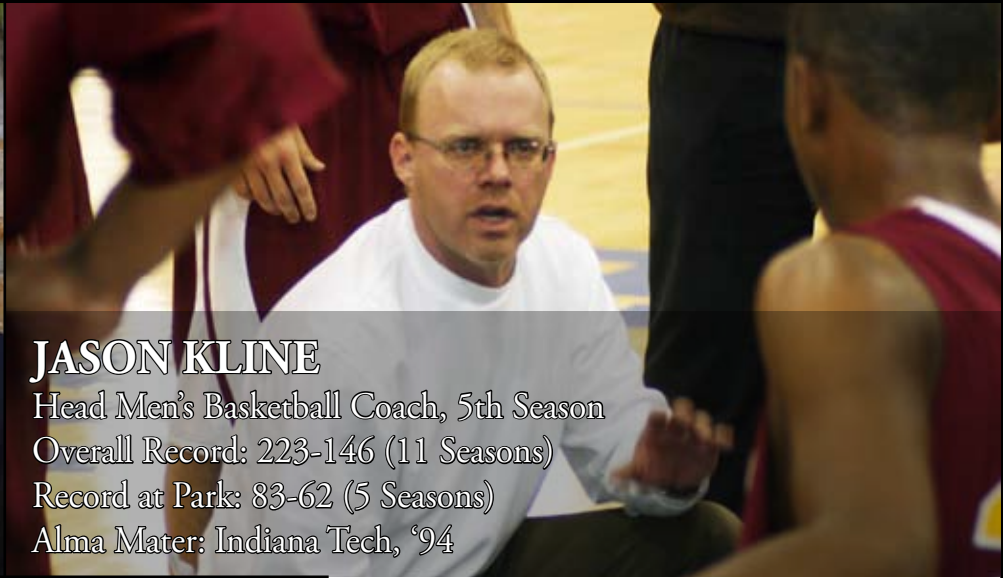
RODGERS CLAIMS SECOND-STRAIGHT AMC PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONOR

For the second consecutive week, Park University's Herschel Rodgers has been selected as the American Midwest Conference Men's Basketball Player of the Week, marking the third weekly honor for the Park senior in 2009-10.

A guard/forward from Lansing, Mich., he continued his superb play in two games for the Pirates last week, averaging 19 points and 10.5 rebounds per outing.

He made 57.1 percent of his field goal attempts (12-of-21) and maintained his shooting touch from the free throw line, making 14-of-17 tries (82.4 percent). Rodgers had a streak of 22 consecutive free throws made that was snapped when he missed his first attempt against McKendree University on Saturday.

In addition to his solid offensive numbers, he added four assists, six steals and a blocked shot in the two contests. Rodgers scored 19 points in both games last week for Park, a 105-65 home win over Missouri Baptist University and an 80-74 loss at home against No. 7-ranked McKendree University. Against the Bearcats, Rodgers netted a double-double with 13 points to go along with his 19 points. He also had five steals in the contest.

Head Men's Basketball Coach, 5th Season

Jason Kline is in his fifth season as the sideline general of the Park men's basketball program, claiming two NAIA Division I Coach of the Year honors and one trip to the NAIA Sweet 16 in the 2006-07 season.

In 2008-09, Kline had the Pirates within a game of playing for the 2009 NAIA Division I Independent Tournament title, falling in the semifinals to Crichton at Tullis Arena in Orangeburg, S.C.

The 2008-09 season also marked the second-straight 16-win campaign for the Pirates, who finished 16-14 with two Daktronics-NAIA Scholar Athletes and one All-American in Jon Meriweather, who was named to the NAIA's Second Team as well as the Preseason First Team distributed by Basketball Times.

On Senior Day, the Pirates made it three-straight seasons with a win over crosstown rival Rockhurst University, drumming the Hawks 79-58.

In all, Park beat two NCAA Division II opponents and took another to the wire, testing NCAA Division II power Southwest Baptist in late November.

Park played 23 of its 30 games on the season against NCAA Division II and ranked NAIA opponents, posting eight wins over ranked NAIA opponents, including six wins over teams who advanced to NAIA national tournaments.

Included in the national-tournament victories were wins over the runner up in NAIA Division I, Columbia, a Division I semifinalist, MidAmerica Nazarene, and a Division I quarterfinalist, McKendree.

The Pirates also beat the runners-up in NAIA Division II basketball, College of the Ozarks, splitting the season series with both NAIA men's basketball runners-up in 2008-09.

Kline posted 16 wins in the 2007-08 season, advancing to the semifinals of the 2008 NAIA Independent Region Tournament in Orangeburg, S.C. Kline also coached an All-American who was also named NAIA Player of the Week at Park for the second-straight year in 2007-08, as Meriweather earned three All-America distinctions as well as two national weekly honors in 2007-08.

In 2006-07, Brandon Voorhees was named to the All-America squad in addition to earning national player of the week honors, also being named Basketball Times Co-Player of the Year at the close of the season.

Kline is 83-62 (.572) in five seasons with the Pirates, including a 26-6 mark in 2006-07, the same year he took the Pirates to the NAIA Sweet 16 at Kansas City's Municipal Auditorium.

The tournament trip was the third in school history for the Pirates and marked the second-longest run in the tournament for a Park University squad.

During the 2007-08 season, Park also had wins over metro-area rival William Jewell, which was preceded by a come-from-behind victory over nationally ranked McKendree at Breckon Sports Center.

In addition to Meriweather's All-American distinctions, Kline's 2007-08 squad also produced three Daktronics-NAIA Scholar Athletes, as Ben Wallis, Michael Zimmerman and Deron Cherry II were named Academic All-Americans by the NAIA, running his total at Park to six nationally recognized student-athletes with academic honors.

The 2006-07 season marked one of the greatest single-season turnarounds in NAIA Men's Basketball history, as the Pirates went from a 10-22 record in 2005-06 to an .813 winning percentage during the NAIA tournament run. In addition to the turnaround and tournament appearance, Park also recorded its first win over an NCAA Division I school under Kline's watch – a 103-99 exhibition triumph over UMKC in November.

Kline came to Park after seven successful seasons at Indiana Tech University in Fort Wayne, Ind., where he led the Warriors to a 140-84 record during his tenure.

In 2004-05, he guided Indiana Tech to a school record 29 wins (eight losses) and the school's second straight NAIA Division II National Tournament appearance, advancing to the Elite Eight.

Over his last three seasons at Indiana Tech, Kline's teams averaged more than 26 wins per year. In each of the last four seasons, his teams finished the regular season in the top 35 of the final NAIA Division II Men's Basketball ratings, including a ranking of eighth in 2003-04 and 15th in 2004-05.

Academically, Kline's players had a graduation rate of 91.4 percent at Tech. Kline, who was named the WHAC (Wolverine-Hoosier Athletic Conference) Coach of the Year in 2003-04, led Indiana Tech to a regular season conference title in 2003-04 and to the WHAC Tournament Championship in 2004-05.

Individually, Kline's players have accumulated a multitude of honors. Seventeen student-athletes have been named NAIA All-America Scholar Athletes under Kline, while 13 have earned athletic All-America honors. Fifty-one players have been tabbed Academic All-Conference honorees, along with 27 All-Conference performers.

Kline, who has an overall coaching record of 223-146 in 11 seasons, started his coaching career as an assistant at Indiana Tech from 1993-95, where he earned his undergraduate degree in business administration in 1994.

Kline then spent three seasons as an assistant coach at Kansas Wesleyan University, in Salina, Kan., which is where he completed his M.B.A. in 1998. He and his wife, Jolina, a former women's basketball student-athlete at Kansas Wesleyan, have two sons, Jacob and Jackson.

PARKVILLE, Mo. - Derrick Howard hit a baseline runner in the lane with 11 seconds left and Park University made a defensive stop in the paint as time expired, sending the Pirates past Livin' the Dream 76-75 in an exhibition nail-biter at Breckon Sports Center.

Howard finished the game with eight points while four Park players found double-figures, led by Herschel Rodgers' 17 points and game-high eight rebounds. Reco Anderson had 14 points in the game, followed by Goldeng Deng and Terrell Dyer, who each had 11.

Former Pirate Walter Bethea led Livin' the Dream with 15 points, while Jairocey Simpson finished with 14 and Kansas State's Schyler Thomas scored nine, matching former Rockhurst standout Alden Smith, who also had nine points.

LTD jumped out to an early lead, getting a three from Thomas, followed by a pair of free-throws by Smith near the 15:00 mark in the first half, giving Livin' the Dream a 10-point lead at 19-9.

Park quickly stormed back with a 9-3 run to cut the lead to three, getting a trey from Deng to make it 21-18 with 12:10 left in the half. A pair of Blayke Ladd foul shots six minutes later cut the lead to one, and Park grabbed its first advantage of the game with 3:47 left in the first, getting a 3-point bucket from Anderson to go up 30-29.

SPRINGFIELD, Mo. - Tyler Price nailed a buzzer-beating jumper as time expired, lifting the Park University men's basketball team to a 75-73 victory over Evangel University in overtime at the Evangel/CBC Classic Saturday in Springfield, Mo.

Park (2-4) won for the second-straight time in Springfield, while Evangel fell to 2-3 after opening the year with a pair of consecutive wins at No. 10 Texas Wesleyan and Southwest Assemblies of God.

LIBERTY, Mo. - The Park University men's basketball team picked up its third-straight win and got a little redemption in the process, holding off William Jewell College 84-75 Tuesday at Jewell's Mabee Center in Liberty, Mo.

Justin Hairston led the Pirates with a career-high 23 points, while Herschel Rodgers scored 13 points and grabbed a team-high nine rebounds, as Park improved to 3-4 on the year. Jewell was led by Nick Larson's 29 points and double-double 10 rebounds, finishing the game 14-of-20 from the floor.

The Cards outrebounded the Pirates in the game, 33-28, but Park finished 30-of-57 from the floor for 52.9-percent while forcing 15 William Jewell turnovers on the defensive end, thanks in-part to 11 Pirate steals.

The Pirates also buried eight 3-point baskets in the game, including three each from above the arc by Hairston and Deng. Jewell was 4-of-16 on its long-range jumpers, and the Cardinals finished the game 13-of-15 at the foul line.

Herschel Rodgers led Park with 22 points, while Kyle Rausch and Juston Hairston each had 11 points for the Pirates, who improved to 11-6 on the season and 4-0 in the AMC. PARKVILLE, Mo. - Park had double-figures from three players, including two off the bench, as Justin Hairston, Tyler Price and Eduardo Quintero notched 12 points each to help No. 25 Park win its seventh-consecutive game and its fifth-straight to open conference play, 89-66, over William Woods University at Breckon Sports Center.

Park (12-6, 5-0 AMC) stayed in first place in the American Midwest Conference with Thursday's win, while William Woods fell to 5-14 and 1-4 in league play despite a game-high 22 points from Logan Decker. Jerone Lester added 10 for the Owls, who were forced into 22 turnovers on 13 Park steals.

The Pirates shot 49.3-percent in the game, including 10-of-24 from beyond the 3-point arc, and Herschel Rodgers helped Park out rebound Woods, 37-30, by grabbing 10 boards in the game.

Park controlled the lead for the game's first six minutes before a William Woods three from Decker put the Owls up 14-12, but after the bucket, Park went on an 8-0 run, going up 20-14 on a lay-up by Kyle Rausch. Price extended the lead to 10 with 10:24 left in the half, draining a three to make it 26-16, and Park pushed ahead by 13 5:00 later, getting a three from Hairston to make it 38-25.

Lester slimmed Park's lead back to 11 with 4:46 left in the half, scoring at the basket to make it 38-27, but Park went on to notch the next six points, including a three by Mark Halsell at the 2:40 mark in the first, putting Park ahead, 44-27.

The Pirates outscored the Owls 7-5 over the final 2:30, taking a 51-32 lead to intermission, and despite a William Woods run out of the break, Park extended its lead past 20 with 6:53 left in the game on a jumper by Quintero that made it 70-49.

William Woods had moved the game to as close as 13 points before the Pirate run, getting a Vern Watkins lay-in with 15:25 to go in the game to make it 56-43, but after the Park run, the Pirates continued to apply pressure, going up by as many as 27, 87-60, on a late-game bucket by Jeremy Voorhees.

PARKVILLE, Mo. - The Park University men's basketball team put three players in double figures, led by a game-high 18 points from Herschel Rodgers, propelling the Pirates to their eighth-straight victory, an 83-59 win Saturday over Hannibal-LaGrange College.

Park (13-6) improved to 6-0 in the American Midwest Conference, adding 15 points from Reco Anderson and 16 from Tyler Price, who was 4-of-8 from outside the 3-point arc. Anderson was 3-of-4 on 3-point attempts, and the Pirates hit 12-of-27 threes in the game.

Hannibal-LaGrange had 13 points off the bench from Gerrell Wells and 10 by Darrell Johnson, but HLG fell victim to a suffocating Park defense that forced 25 Trojan turnovers on 20 team steals. Goldeng Deng led the team with five steals, while Anderson added four, and Kyle Rausch was the team's leading rebounder by grabbing 11 boards in the game.

Park outrebounded Hannibal-LaGrange in the contest, 31-27, as the Trojans fell to 6-13 on the year and 1-5 in conference games. HLG marked the seventh-consecutive Park opponent held to less than 70 points.

The Pirates grabbed the game's initial lead in the first minute on Derrick Howard's three-point play, and Park's smothering defense earned steals on the game's first three possessions, helping the Pirates go up 6-2 at the 18:00 mark in the first half, on a three by Justin Hairston, who finished with nine points.

Hannibal-LaGrange went on a 5-0 run to take its only lead of the game, 7-6, but on Park's next possession, Deng nailed a three, putting Park up 9-7. Anderson followed with a three on the team's next possession, and Rodgers finished at the basket to cap a 9-0 Park run, giving the Pirates a 15-7 lead.

Park pushed its advantage to double digits over the next two minutes, getting a three from Price near the 13:00 mark to make it 24-9, and five minutes later, Hairston buried another from outside the arc to put the Pirates up 31-16.

The Pirates ended the half by outscoring the Trojans 16-12, taking a 47-28 lead to the half, and Howard maintained the lead for the Pirates four minutes into the second period, getting a put-back bucket to make it 53-32.

Two possessions later, Hairston downed another three, capping an 8-0 Park run, and as the clock neared 10:00, the Pirates extended the lead to 68-38.

PARKVILLE, Mo. - Park University reached 100 points for the first time at home since the 2006-07 season and six players reached double-figures Tuesday night, helping the Pirates knock off Missouri Baptist University, 105-65, at Breckon Sports Center in Parkville.

No. 24 Park (14-6, 7-0 AMC) also posted its largest home-court margin of victory since Jan. 8, 2004, when the Pirates beat Union (Neb.), 108-62.

Herschel Rodgers led all scorers with 19 points and had eight rebounds in Tuesday's game, while Goldeng Deng finished with 15 points and Juston Hairston, Derrick Howard, Terrell Dyer and Eduardo Quintero each had 10.

Brandon Roberson led Missouri Baptist (10-10, 2-3) with 15 points, followed by 13 from Kyle Hubbard and 10 points out of Kansas City-native Garrison Plummer. Park shot 63.6-percent in the game, including 72.7-percent in the first half, when the team built a 20-point lead just eight minutes into the game, going up 27-7 on a lay-up by Quintero.

The Pirates moved the lead to 30 a minute before the end of the period, getting a lay-in by Kyle Rausch to make it 56-25, and Park took a 31-point lead to the break on a buzzer-beater in the lane from Rodgers to make it 58-27.

Park later extended its lead to 40 with 7:38 to go in the game, getting a three from senior guard Terrell Dyer to make it 89-49, and Park maintained the lead over the final seven minutes, benefitting from a pair of dunks in the final minute from Travis Fairley, who finished with eight points, to secure the 40-point victory.

The Pirates established their lead with a smothering defense, forcing Missouri Baptist into 21 turnovers on 14 steals, with 37 points off MoBap miscues and 22 fast-break points. Park led wire-to-wire in the game, outrebounding the Spartans 32-30.

PARKVILLE, Mo. - Herschel Rodgers had a double-double with 19 points and 13 rebounds while Terrell Dyer scored a game-high 20, but No. 24 Park was unable to come from behind against No. 7 McKendree, falling to the Bearcats 80-74 in the College Fanz NAIA Game of the Week.

Park (14-7, 7-1 AMC) trailed nearly all of the first half, but late in the game, the Pirates used a 13-3 run to knot the game at 63, and Park had the score tied at 70 as late as 1:36 left in the game.

McKendree (17-5, 6-0) withstood the run, though, finishing the game on a 10-4 run, including a perfect 8-for-8 from the foul line in the game's final 1:10.

Travis Fairley also finished in double-figures for the Pirates, scoring 11 points, while five players were in double-digits for McKendree, led by Kenny Detmer's 16.

McKendree opened the game with a 10-3 run to cover the game's first 5:00, but Park got back into the contest with 11:26 left in the first half when Tyler Price drilled the Pirates' only 3-pointer of the game, cutting the lead to 12-10.

Five minutes later, Dyer buried a pair of free throws to tie it at 18, and with 5:06 in the half, Dyer converted another pair from the foul line to hand the Pirates a one-point lead, 22-21.

McKendree quickly answered with the next three points to go up 24-22, and after Dyer again gave Park a one-point lead with 2:55 left in the first, 26-25, McKendree finished the half on a 7-4 run, going to intermission up 32-30.

The Bearcats came firing out of the locker room in the second half and had a nine-point lead with 13:46 to play, getting a pair of free throws from Pettiford to make it 46-37, and McKendree extended its lead to 10 on a three by Hobbie at the 12:55 mark, 49-39.

ST. LOUIS, Mo. - Kyle Rausch scored a game-high 20 points and added a double-double with 13 rebounds Thursday, helping No. 24 Park University to an 86-63 victory over Missouri Baptist University at Muncy Gymnasium in St. Louis.

Park (15-7, 8-1 AMC) also had 19 points from Goldeng Deng, and Terrell Dyer finished the game with 10. Kyle Hubbard scored 19 and matched Rausch's total on the glass, pulling down 13 boards, as Missouri Baptist fell back below .500, dropping to 11-12 and 3-5 in the American Midwest Conference.

Missouri Baptist kept things close over the game's initial minutes, as Park led 16-14 before a 10-0 run, including a pair of Tyler Price threes and a dunk by Travis Fairley, put the Pirates up 26-14 with 12:00 left in the first half.

Park pushed its lead to 14 when Deng netted six-straight points seven minutes later, capped by a lay-in at the 5:00 mark that made it 40-26, and Park went into the halftime locker room up 47-36.

Three minutes into the second period, Herschel Rodgers maintained lead, 51-40, and Rausch hit a pair of buckets in the lane over the next two minutes to put the Pirates ahead 57-43. Later, with 13:15 left in the game, Dyer found the basket to make it a 16-point contest, 61-43.

Park pushed the lead to 18 on its next possession with a dunk by Derrick Howard, and with 6:30 remaining in the game, Deng splashed from outside the 3-point arc to run the lead to 20, 72-52.

Mark Halsell later hit 2-of-4 free throws down the stretch, giving the Pirates an 81-56 lead, and Park held on over the final three minutes despite being outscored to earn a 23-point win, marking the sixth conference scoring outing of 80 points or more.

The Pirates outrebounded the Spartans 38-31 in the game, and Park shot 48.7-percent, while MoBap managed 40-percent from the floor, including 13 points from Rondu Stevens, 11 from Jordan Flora and 10 points out of Brandon Roberson.
