PIRATES HIT THE ROAD TO FACE MO BAP THURSDAY

PARKVILLE, Mo. - After dropping the College Fanz NAIA Game of the Week to McKendree last Saturday at home, the Park University women's basketball team will look to bounce back this Thursday, as they travel to St. Louis, Mo. to take on Missouri Baptist at 5:30 p.m.

The Pirates and Spartans last met on Saturday, January 26 at the Breckon Sports Center, where Mo Bap blew out Park, 86-57.

MBU has gone 1-1 since last competing against the Pirates, losing to William Woods, 85-70, on the road on Jan. 28, but defeated Hannibal-LaGrange, 69-60, on January 30 at home. The Spartans are currently 12-8 on the year and 4-4 in AMC play.

Park on the other hand is 3-18 on the year and 2-7 in conference action. The Pirates have also gone 1-1 since taking on the Spartans. Park went on the road and took down Stephens College, 67-58, on January 28, but lost to McKendree, 74-43, last Saturday.

Park has one two straight road conference games, beating Stephens and Harris-Stowe State, 68-42, back on January 19.

MBU also features the AMC's leading scorer in Megan Payton, who averages 18.1 points per game. Payton did not play in the game against Park a few weeks back. Payton shoots 64-percent from the floor, but hasn't played since Jan. 21 against Columbia.

Park's leading scorer and rebounder this season has consistently been forward Dominique Hayes. The 6-1 Kansas City, Mo. product, averages 11.2 points and 8.3 rebounds per game.

In front of a nationally broadcasted audience last Saturday, Hayes scored 21 points and grabbed eight rebounds in the loss at home against McKendree.

Hilary Walker has played well for the Pirates as of late, with her eight blocks against Stephens, Walker now ranks 18th in the country in blocks per game. She also ranks No. 20 in the nation in total blocks with 31.

As a team the Pirates rank No. 24 in the country in total steals with 232. Walker also has the team high in total steals with 41. Park has caused 30 more turnovers this season than they have committed.

NOTES ON PARK...

- Over 1,000 people attended last Saturday's game against McKendree at the Breckon Sports Center, marking Park's first sell out crowd of the year.
- 4,536 fans have attended Park University's nine women's basketball games this year.

NOTES ON MISSOURI BAPTIST...

- Mo Bap's four conference wins have come against Park, Stephens College, Harris-Stowe State and Hannibal-LaGrange.
- MBU ranks No. 11 in the country in team scoring average at 78 points per game.
- They also rank No. 12 in the nation in steals per game, with 12.7 per contest.

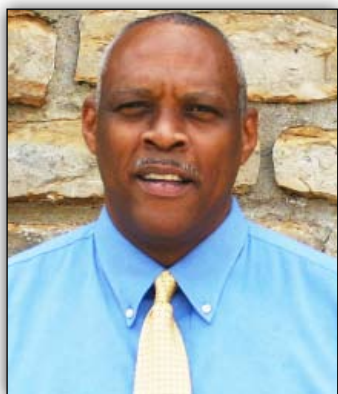

HEAD COACH JOE C. MERIWEATHER



Joe C. Meriweather enters his 13th season as the head coach of the women's basketball program at Park University.

Meriweather is the all-time winningest coach in Park's women's basketball history with his 126 career wins.

The Pirates posted a 5-22 record in 2008-09 and featured a career 1,000 point, 700 rebound performer in Meghan Cummings. The St. Joseph, Mo., native collected her 1,000th career point on the road at Avila University on February 10 and her 700th rebound on February 7 against Brescia University at home.

In 2007-08, Park finished 15-15 on the year. Meriweather led his 2007-08 squad to a 4-1 conference record and a second-place finish in the NAIA Independent Region Women's Championship. Meriweather also helped guide Ashley Birch to a 2008 NAIA All-American Honorable Mention selection.

In 2005, Meriweather guided the Pirates to a 19-12 overall record as Park qualified for the NAIA Division I National Tournament for the first time in school history. For his efforts, he was named the 2005-06 NAIA Division I Independent Region Coach of the Year.

In his thirteen-year career at Park, the 1998 AMC Coach of the Year has posted a 124-233 record, but over the last eight seasons his teams have won over 100 games, including a school record 22 wins (3 losses) in 2003-04.

Before taking the helm of the Pirate program, Meriweather enjoyed a long professional career in the NBA and overseas. Drafted in the first round by the Houston Rockets in 1975, he also played for the Atlanta Hawks, New Orleans Jazz, New York Knicks and played his final five seasons with the Kansas City Kings from 1980-85. During his 10-year NBA career, he averaged 8.1 points and 5.6 rebounds per game. Following his time in the NBA, Meriweather played abroad in Badalona, Spain, and Bologna, Italy.

Meriweather played collegiately at Southern Illinois University from 1973-75, where he still ranks eighth among the school's all-time career scoring leaders (1,536) and third all-time in rebounding with (1,005). During his time at SIU, he played on the United States National Team that finished third at the 1974 World Championships in San Juan, Puerto Rico.

Following his playing career, Meriweather served as general manager and head coach of the Kansas City Mustangs women's professional team from 1992 to 1995. He has also coached in the Kansas City metro area at Bishop Hogan High School and Penn Valley Community College.

Meriweather earned his bachelor's degree from Southern Illinois in 1975 and earned a master's degree in public administration from Park University in 2002.
