PARK, MNU RENEW RIVALRY TUESDAY

Park University will meet MidAmerica Nazarene University for the fourth time in its women's soccer program's history Tuesday night at Julian Field, with kickoff scheduled for 5 p.m., as the Pirates look to go 2-0 in 2010 and 4-0 in the all-time series between the two schools.

Park (1-0) coasted by the University of Sioux Falls in its season opener, defeating the Cougars 6-0 on Aug. 21, while MNU will begin its season with the first of two road games, also traveling to Southern Nazarene University on Saturday.

MNU and Park last met in 2008 in Olathe, Kan., with Park earning a 2-1 victory at Pioneer Field.

In Park's opener against USF, both Ashley Maxwell and Juneille Watkins had two goals and an assist, while Lisa Buzzotta came up with the season's first goal and Madeline Sund scored her first career goal in the win.

Dana Hemmingsen also had an assist in the game, taking seven shots. Maxwell led the team in shots, taking 15 with nine shots on goal, and she leads the country in shots and shots on goal per game.

Monika Stoiber and Ellen Ghirardi have both spent time in goal for the Pirates, with Stoiber playing 70-plus minutes with a save and a victory. Ghirardi played the final 19:28 of Park's win over USF, helping the Pirates record a team shutout.

MidAmerica Nazarene returns a solid core from the 2009 season, bringing back both goal keepers and its top three goal scorers from last year's roster. Sophomore Becca Skillman played the majority of the minutes for the Pioneers last season as a freshman, posting 77 saves while allowing 22 goals in 99 shots

facéd. Alanna Russo also played sparingly, appearing in four games with eight saves and two goals allowed.

Rebecca McAndrew returns for her senior season after scoring 12 Pioneer goals with one assist last season, while Alyssa Howard is also back on the MNU roster for her senior campaign after scoring five times last year with two assists.

Emily Bean scored three goals last year for MNU, returning for her junior year, hoping to help the Pioneers improve on a 8-9-1 record and a 4-5 mark in the Heart of America Athletic Conference.

BUZZOTTA LANDS FIRST-CAREER GAME WINNER

Lisa Buzzotta came into the 2010 season opener with seven career goals, but in three previous seasons in a Park uniform, the Chesterfield, Mo., native had never netted a game winner.

That changed against the University of Sioux Falls.

Just two minutes into the contest, Buzzotta found the back of the net from just left of the post, registering her eighth career goal and her first game winner, moving her career points total to 24. The goal also marked the first of six scores in the 2010 season opener, helping the Pirates to their fourth-most lopsided season-opening win in program history.

PIRATES EARN EIGHTH-EVER SEASON-OPENING SHUTOUT

With the team's 6-0 win over Sioux Falls, Park University registered its eighth season-opening shutout in school history, including the third-straight under head coach Ken Hefner. Park also shut out Avila, 7-0, in 2009, and John Brown, 1-0, in 2008.

Park's first season-opening shutout came in 1995, defeating McKendree, 12-0, marking the widest winning margin in a season opener in the school's women's soccer history.

STOIBER'S STREAK ENDS

Monika Stoiber played all 1,681:39 in goal last season for Park University, and through the first 70:32, she was still the only goal keeper to see time between the pipes for the Pirates since Megan Newland appeared in the second half of the team's final game, at the NAIA national tournament, in the 2008 season.

Stoiber's consecutive minutes streak halted at 1,752:11 when Ellen Ghirardi came in with 19:28 left in the 2010 season opener. Last season, Stoiber made 60 saves and allowed 10 goals, and in 2010, she has the team's only save and neither goal keeper has surrendered a score on the year.

MAXWELL, WATKINS START STRONG; SUND SCORES FIRST-CAREER GOAL

Ashley Maxwell added to her career goals total with a two-goal performance in the team's season opener, pushing her career total to 31, and in the process she added her eighth-career assist by providing the final touch before Lisa Buzzotta's game winner. Maxwell leads the country in shots per game (15) and shots on goal per game (nine), while pushing her career points total to 70.

Juneille Watkins also got off to a strong start, providing her 11th and 12th career goals in addition to her fourth-career assist in the win over Sioux Falls. The Pirates also had a first-career goal scored against USF when freshman Madeline Sund teed one up from 40 yards out, finding the back of the net for the team's fifth goal of the day.

Ken Hefner enters his sixth season as the head coach of the Park University women's soccer program, entering the season with a mark of 60-28-9 at Park, while his overall record, including 29 wins as a men's head coach, is 213-161-18.

During the 2009 season, Hefner's Pirates were within striking distance of an American Midwest Conference title throughout the regular season, scoring 63 goals on the year while using a smothering defense that held opponents to just 10 scores on the year.

Hefner guided the Pirates to 10 wins in 2009, marking the 20th winning season in 22 years of women's soccer at Park. It was also the 19th season with at least 10 wins in the 22-year history of Park's women's soccer program.

The 2009 season was also the fifth-straight under Hefner that saw the Pirates qualify for the postseason, ending the year in the 2010 American Midwest Conference Tournament semifinals at Missouri Baptist.

Hefner led the Pirates to their eighth NAIA tournament appearance in 2008, earning an opening-round draw before advancing to the second round and final site on penalty kicks at Dordt College.

Park finished the year with a 14-2-3 record, losing to NAIA national champion Lee University in Daytona Beach, Fla. Park also claimed its third-straight MCAC regular-season championship and fourth in the last five years, capping the conference season with a second-straight MCAC tournament championship at Julian Field.

At the conclusion of the 2008 season, Hefner gathered a pair of honors, being named NSCAA/adidas NAIA Midwest Region Coach of the Year, as well as MCAC Co-Coach of the Year. He also coached nine all-conference players in 2008, two of which went on to be named NAIA All-Americans.

Hefner had the Pirates within one win of a trip to Daytona Beach, Fla., and the NAIA tournament in the 2007 season, but a loss to Kansas Wesleyan in the Region IV final ended the season at 12-5-2. The Pirates were MCAC regular-season tri-champions and MCAC tournament champions, while also producing an honorable mention All-American during the year.

In 2006, Hefner led the Pirates to a regular season MCAC championship, going 5-0 in conference play. Park dropped the tournament final to Bellevue, 1-0 but beat Kansas Wesleyan in the Region IV Tournament, advancing to the school's fifth consecutive appearance at the NAIA National Tournament. Hefner led the women past College of the Southwest in Round One but then fell to No. 4 Houghton College out of New York in Round Two. Hefner was honored as the Region IV Coach of the Year and MCAC Co-Coach of the Year.



Hefner ranks as the eighth winningest coaches in NAIA history, owning 174 career women's wins in two seasons at Park, seven seasons at Lindsey Wilson College (1993-1999) and three seasons at Tennessee Wesleyan College (1990-93). Additionally, Hefner posted 19 wins as the head coach at NCAA Division I Arkansas State, helping his career coaching wins total to eighth all-time among NAIA women's coaches.

He also has 29 men's wins from his time at Tennessee Wesleyan to push his overall career total to 189 wins.

While at Lindsey Wilson, Hefner's teams advanced to the national tournament twice (1998, 1999) and achieved a final national ranking of fifth following the 1999 season. In seven seasons at Lindsey Wilson, he posted a 93-46-5 record and had 11 players earn NAIA All-America honors.

In 1999, Hefner was tabbed to lead a start-up soccer program at Arkansas State, which began play in 2000. His teams qualified for the Sun Belt Conference tournament four years in a row under his guidance and had three players named to the all-conference team from 2000-2003.

In addition to Hefner's success on the field, his players have enjoyed success in the classroom. At Lindsey Wilson, he had 18 academic all-conference selections and eight NAIA Scholar-Athletes. During his time at Arkansas State, his team owned an overall GPA of 3.0 or better in six of seven semesters while he was at ASU.

Hefner has guided the women's soccer program to three-straight NAIA Scholar Team designations, and eight players have been named Daktronics-NAIA Scholar-Athletes during his tenure at Park University.

He has also coached second- and third-team NAIA All-Americans while at Park, with a handful of players also earning NAIA Honorable Mention All-America designations. In 2009, Hefner's program had five all-conference honorees and eight academic all-conference designations.

Hefner, who owns a United States Soccer Federation National "B" License, an Advanced National License and an NSCAA National Diploma, earned a bachelor of arts in psychology from West Georgia College in 1987. He and his wife, Dawn, have three children, Matthew (24), Megan (23) and Mackenzie (19).

PARKVILLE, Mo. - Ashley Maxwell took a career-high 15 shots and came away with two goals in Park University' season opener, helping the Pirates to a 6-0 win over the University of Sioux Falls Saturday afternoon at

Julian Field in Parkville.

Park (1-0-0) also had a pair of scores from Juneille Watkins, who also had an assist in the game. Maxwell also finished with an assist, while Lisa Buzzotta and Madeline Sund provided the Pirates' additional scores.

Sioux Falls fell to 0-1-0 with the loss, posting three shots and one shot on goal. Kelsey Van Puersem took the loss for the Cougars, making five saves in 45 minutes between the posts, while Samantha Maybon played the second half for USF, allowing Park's three second-half goals. She also had seven saves.

"I was happy with the way we played and with what we found out about ourselves today," said head coach Ken Hefner. "We handled the heat pretty well and we were able to keep pressure on them for a full 90 minutes. Anytime you hold a team to three shots, your defense had a good day. I'm happy with our performance today."

The Pirates outshot USF, 35-3, including an 18-1 advantage in shots on goal, and Park found itself with a lead just two minutes into the game when Buzzotta slipped a shot past the right post from the left side off of a pass from Maxwell.

Maxwell made it 2-0 in the 19th minute, finding the back of the net off of a deflection, and Watkins put the Pirates up 3-0 at intermission, scoring her first goal of the season off of Dana Hemmingsen's corner kick. Hemmingsen also had seven shots in the game, placing two on goal.

Park added its fourth goal at the end of the 47th minute when Maxwell tipped in a shot by Watkins, and in the 54th minute, Sund sent a booming shot past the USF keeper from 40 yards away. Watkins scored the team's final goal in the 65th minute, getting an unassisted score after rebounding a USF deflection and finding the back of the net to make it 6-0.

Watkins finished the game with four shots, including two shots on goal, while Buzzotta and Nichole Hemmingsen each had two shots in the game, each with a shot on goal.

Monika Stoiber got the win in goal for the Pirates, making one save in 71 minutes, while Ellen Ghirardi finished the final 19 minutes of the game for Park, seeing just one off-frame shot.
